

Light of the Torah

Parashat Devarim: Impartial Judgement

Moshe begins the book of Devarim with a reminder of what happened to the people of Israel in the past 40 years. Our Parsha is mainly dedicated to the summary of the travels of Israelites, but before revealing the story, Moshe sets out some fundamental laws. "Hear out your brother-Israelites, and decide justly between one party and the other—be it a brother-Israelite or a stranger. You shall not be partial in judgment: hear out low and high alike. Fear no human being, for judgment is God's." (Deut 1:16-17)

It is interesting to notice that these are the only laws mentioned in this parsha, and they preface the entire speech of Moshe. It underlines the importance of the concept of Justice in the Torah, but it also applies to the story of Moshe as if he is saying to us, "I am going to tell you this story as truthfully as I can, and you judge it rightly. But I will also judge Israelities and rebuke them if needed". Indeed Moshe, in this parsha, rebukes Israelites who did not have faith in God and refused to conquer the land. This week we commemorate Tisha B'Av, remembering the destruction of Jerusalem. Babylonian Talmud, Shabbat 119b teaches us: "Rav Amram said that Rabbi Shimon

bar Abba said that Rabbi <u>H</u>anina said: Jerusalem was destroyed only because the people did not rebuke one another, as it is stated: "Her ministers were like stags that found no pasture (Lamentations 1:6). Just as this stag [turns] its head toward the other's tail, so too, the Jewish people in that generation lowered their faces to the ground and did not rebuke one another".

Our parsha and words of Moshe remind us of the same thing — we are obligated to execute a fair judgment and bear a communal responsibility for it. May we all have the wisdom to judge rightly, and may Jerusalem never be destroyed again.

STUDY SESSION WITH RABBI ALISA ZILBERSHTEIN

Kinot for Tisha B'Av: The Poetry of Mourning

On the 9th of Av, we are obligated to mourn for the tragedies that befell the Jewish nation. Traditionally the special mindset of grieving is achieved through the recitation of the *kinot*.

There are nearly 50 kinot for Tisha B'Av that are customarily recited in order to experience the sense of sorrow and longing for the destroyed Temple, people that died tragically, and ultimately for God, The Holy One, Blessed be He.

On this day, we are going to do an in-depth study of Kinah 26, which is describing the mystical interaction

between the prophet Jeremiah, patriarchs Abraham, Isaac, Yaakov, Moshe and matriarchs Leah, Rachel, Zilpah, and Bilhah. We are going to dive deep into the text, its history and poetry and use it to enrich our spiritual experience of Tisha B'Av.
