**"In the tents of Yakov"** by Rabbi Alisa Zilbershtein

In this week's parshat Balak, the Mesopotamian prophet Bilam utters the most beautiful and unexpected words, "How fair are your tents, O Yakov, Your dwellings, O Israel!" (Numbers 24:5).

The "*Mah tovu ohale<u>h</u>a Yakov*" prayer is traditionally recited every day upon entering the synagogue which is our "fair tent of Yakov", our holy space. The prayer continues, "*Va'ani be'rov <u>hasdeha</u> avo veite<u>ha</u> eshta<u>h</u>aveh El Heichal Kodshe<u>h</u>a be'yirate<u>h</u>a", "As for me, through*  Your abundant grace, I enter your house to worship with awe in Your sacred place."

Our sages teach that holiness follows the children of Israel wherever they go. The Torah says that the Holy One, Blessed be He, is with us always. "In every place where I cause My name to be mentioned, I will come to you and bless you." (Exodus 20:21) Israel and the land are spiritually bound and have permanent and unique relationships – this is referred to as "the dwelling place." But wherever else Jewish people happen to be, even in temporary "tents," here too, the holiness is revealed to us.

That is why it said that Bilam saw the camp of Israelites from above the mountain in the wilderness before the Israelites entered the promised land. In addition to that, the blessing of Bilam refers to Yakov, who wandered outside of the Land of Israel. Whether he is in the "tents" of Canada or Ukraine or "the dwelling place" of Israel, the all-encompassing glory of God's presence sustains and protects us.



#### ALL ABOUT YAHRZEIT REMINDERS

# 1) When do the Yahrzeit Reminders get sent out?

By e-mail: on the 15th of the month, one month before the Yahrzeit. Paper notices take a bit longer to go out as they are mailed through the postal service.

# 2) How does Beth Tikvah know to send out a reminder?

All current members and Adath Shalom members receive Yahrzeit notices if they have them filed with us. Non members or past members do not receive notices.

#### 3) How can I access the Yahrzeit info at any time?

Log into your account on the Beth Tikvah website with your e-mail address. Click on "My Account" and then choose "My Yahrzeits" from the options displayed as you scroll down.

#### 4) Important notes:

• Members who SHARE e-mail addresses cannot receive Yahrzeit notices. Each member needs to have a separate, individual e-mail address in order to receive their notice by e-mail. If you share an e-mail address, please let the office know.

• If you do not receive your notice by the 15th of the previous month, please check your Spam / trash folder first. Make sure you are not sharing an e-mail address with your spouse / partner, and then let us know (if the above reasons do not apply).

• Yahrzeits start the night before - so for example, if the Yahrzeit says to observe on July 12, 2022, one would light the Yahrzeit candle and attend Minha starting on July 11th in the evening after sundown through to sundown on July 12th.
