Parshat Emor: Leadership Means Serving Others, Not Being Served

והכהן הגדול מאחיו

Our parsha deals with many topics and rituals. Among them are some of the laws of the Kohanim. Today we think of leaders often as those who get special rights and privileges because of their position. Judaism however offers a different model of what it means to lead.

The Sefat Emet, a 19th century Polish Hasidic Rebbe, taught that the command Moses received to sanctify Aaron, was actually a commandment to Aaron to remember that his role is bestowed on him by others. His power and authority are not a personal characteristic, but instead something given to him by those he serves. The Sefat Emet goes on to teach that we can learn this from the very words the Torah uses to describe the high priest.

The JPS translation renders these words as, "the priest who exalted above his fellows," another translates it as, "The kohein who is greatest among his brethren." But the Sefat Emet explains that a more correct understanding would be "the priest that from his brothers is made great."

The lesson is simple, being in power demands remembering those who aren't, and acting for them. Today many leaders forget this important lesson our tradition teaches.

Leadership is service, that the authority one is granted isn't meant to be wielded for one's own design, but in service of the others.




