Learning From a Burned Radiator Pipe

The mitzvah of Shmitta and Yovel leaving the land fallow and not growing crops — appears to be a difficult mitzvah to appreciate. After all, the mitzvah causes landowners anguish over their inability to provide sustenance for their families.

Interestingly, Rabbi Abraham Saba (Spain, 1440-1508) says that this is precisely the point of this mitzvah! He explains that while the poor often live with food insecurity, the rich generally take their lifestyle for granted. So much so, that they often forget about the suffering of the poor. Therefore, God instructs the wealthy of society to refrain from producing crops

so that they will also wonder what they will have to eat and how they will provide for their families-the same feelings that the needy face every day. As a result of being placed in a situation of insecurity, all will feel more responsible and willing to provide for the needy.

Rabbi Moshe Kormornick relates a similar story: "This week, I personally came to appreciate Rabbi Saba's interpretation. As I drive to a Kollel in the afternoonsoften at the last minute-I occasionally pass people who are looking for a ride to different places on the way. Because I want to reach there on time, I do not always stop to pick up people on the way because it will usually cause me some




