Sabbath Musings

WITH RABBI LOUIS SACHS



The Fruit of Torah

Our parsha this week contains a simple verse with an important lesson. In chapter 26, verse 3, God promises that, "If you walk in My laws, keep My commandments, and do them," good things will happen. The 12th century philosopher Rabbi Ibn Ezra distinguishes the three actions contained in this verse.

We must "walk" in God's laws by studying them. We "keep" God's commandments by teaching them. Finally, after both of these, we must still perform them.

Each week, we come together to shul and listen to words of Torah, but that is not enough. We must go

out into the world and share the lessons of Torah with others, and practice its teachings in our lives. There is a rabbinic teaching that one who merely studies Torah alone is compared to a farmer who plants seeds but does not harvest the crop. To fully reap the benefits we must do all three.

What we do in the sanctuary each Shabbat can not be left in the sanctuary the other six days. To do so is simply to plant a new crop each week and never enjoy its fruit. Instead, we must carry the lessons of our faith with us into the world, teaching them to others, and living their wisdom each and every day.

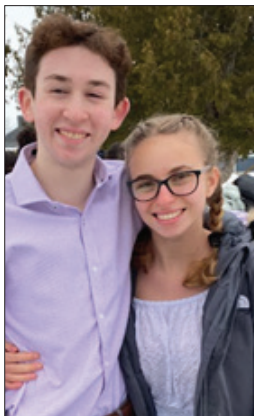

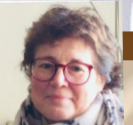

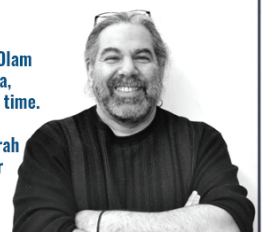
