

Sukkot

On Sukkot we are famously commanded to have a happy celebration! וְשִּׁמְחָהָ בְּחַגֵּךְ וְהָנִייָת אַךְ "Vsamahta b'hagekha, v'hayeetah akh sameah," You shall rejoice in your festival and you shall have nothing but joy. (Deut 16:14-15)


But what is joy? There are so many ways to be happy! Talmud Bavli Tractate Shabbat 30B has an interesting discussion about the meaning of joy based on the seeming contradiction in the book of Ecclesiastes. It is written "I therefore praised enjoyment." (Ecc 8:15) and it is also written "And of mirth, What good is that?" Why in one place is it said that joy is commanded and in another that the joy is futile?

Talmud explains, "So I commended mirth," that is the joy of a mitzvah. "And of mirth: What good is that?" that is joy that is not the joy of a mitzvah. The praise of joy mentioned

here is to teach you that the Divine Presence rests upon an individual neither from an atmosphere of sadness, nor from an atmosphere of laziness, nor from an atmosphere of laughter, nor from an atmosphere of frivolity, nor from an atmosphere of idle conversation, nor from an atmosphere of idle chatter, but rather from an atmosphere imbued with the joy of a mitzvah."

Such joy, says Rabbi Ismar Schorsch, results only when our action no longer springs from the burden of external obligation but from inner personal desire. Practice is the key to making mitzvahs our own. As we learn to do them with ease and beauty, they begin to reward us with the uplifting that comes from God's presence.

Wishing everyone a truly joyful, kosher Sukkot and a deep sense of connection to our loved ones, to our community and to the Blessed Holy One!


