Having a Mitzvah Mindset

According to a simple understanding of our parsha, one who does not perform the mitzvot in the Torah is cursed. How can we take this at face value when there are so many mitzvot some that only certain people are able to perform! The Torah sets up a seemingly impossible standard.

Rabbi Chaim ibn Attar (Morocco, 18th c.) explains that the Torah is not telling us that we are cursed for not performing every mitzvah; rather, the curse is referring to one who is not willing to perform a mitzvah that may "come his way." If a Jew encounters the opportunity to fulfill a mitzvah, she must be unhesitant in fulfilling it.

Once, the great Rav Eliyashiv (Israel, 20th c.) hired an electrician to do some work in his home. While he was working, Rav Elyashiv was informed that his daughter had passed away. Overhearing the commotion, the electrician quickly finished his work, and returned home without giving a bill to the rabbi. While preparing for the funeral, Rav Eliyashiv asked his grandson to request the electrician return. He wanted to pay the electrician for his work in order to fulfil the mitzvah of paying one's worker on the day he completes his job. Only once he had done that, he agreed to leave for his daughter's funeral.






The Upcoming Israeli Election and Other Topics Making the Headlines
