Shabbat haGadol

The Shabbat immediately before Passover, is known as *Shabbat haGadol* – The Great Shabbat! There are many different explanations of why this Shabbat receives a unique name, and interestingly the answer is still debated. While there is not a single reason universally accepted, there is a universal custom to learn about the upcoming holiday on this Shabbat.

The Passover *seder* follows a complex script. There is a rigorous and exacting order to when the various rituals are performed. The rabbis explain that this is because there are two different parts of the *mitzvah* that we fulfill at the *seder*.

The commandment is *sippur yetziat mitzraiym*, or to tell the story of leaving Egypt. Despite the verbal nature of this command, "to tell," the rabbis understand that the story is told through both words and acts.

To perform the seder's rituals out of order would satisfy only part of the holiday's obligation. One can perform the act of drinking wine or eating *maror*, but without telling the story, they still haven't fulfilled the commandment. Similarly, one could tell the story without actually doing any of the acts required.

It is an important lesson for us. Words without actions are empty, and acts without intention are meaningless.

Whether it is the *mitzvah* of the *seder*, Shabbat prayers, or simply moments in our daily life – we must unite both our words and deeds. Judaism requires that we live with intention, that our thoughts and actions be united as one.



Passover 5782 Siyyum Bekhorim

(study session for the first born)

The sunrise to sunset **Tannit bekhorim** (fast of the firstborn) is the only fast that applies to just a segment of the community: all males who are the firstborn children in their families. The father or mother of a child too young to fast, fast for him.

There is a widely practiced exemption: On the principle that fasting is prohibited on a joyous occasion, Judaism allows for anyone attending a religious feast to forego fasting.

Therefore, we hold a celebratory meal on the completion of the study of a tractate of Talmud, called a siyyum (conclusion). This is considered a seudat (meal) mitzvah (in honour of a commandment; in this case, studying Torah).
