Torah on Tour

On Clothing

Parshat Tetsavveh talks about clothing, a theme that is introduced early on in the Torah. Adam and Eve started wearing clothes after they sinned and ate from the Tree of Knowledge. In their shame (Bosh) they covered themselves with clothes (L'Vosh). Clothing was needed to cover that which had now become exposed.

At the same time, clothing bespeaks a person's position, ranking or job in society. A person wearing a white coat in a hospital usually is identified as a doctor. A policemen, judge

or soldier is clearly identified. Similarly the Kohen Gadol, the High priest in the Temple had roles and functions to perform. As such he would wear special clothing that represented his station in society. The level of the position gave rise to his own unique set of clothes.

So too today, Jewish people wear clothing that sets us apart as unique among the nations. When we wear our kippot in public, we make a statement about our values, beliefs and pride in our Jewish identities. Dressing modestly is meant to reflect a modest manner of behaviour. Everyday activities can also be holy; think about that the next time you get dressed!




