# Sabbath Musings

WITH RABBI LOUIS SACHS

## Ki Tissa: The Boundaries Set Us Free

The rabbis teach that the sin of the golden calf took place before the commandment to build the tabernacle was given. Anyone who has been following along would justifiably be confused. We read about the golden calf this shabbat, and the building of the tabernacle was read two weeks ago in parshat terumah!

But the bigger question isn't how can they suggest this, but why? What are they trying to teach?

The lesson is an important one, when the Israelites faith was left undirected, they worshiped idols. Spirituality without limits, without rules and confines, might have been God's initial plan, but we can learn from our ancestors' mistakes that it didn't work.

Without a structure for worship, they quickly turned to idols. Today, with the pressures of society, it is easy



to elevate false goals and values as if they were divine. But our tradition offers us a solution to avoid the trap of modern-day idolatry. The boundaries of halakha help us to focus our innate desire for spiritual connection in the right direction.

As Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel once wrote, "I am not always in a mood to pray. I do not always have the vision and the strength to say a word in the presence of God. But when I am weak, it is the law that gives me strength; when my vision is dim, it is duty that gives me insight."

Sometimes it is the boundaries of ritual, the limits placed on us by mitzvot, that allow our spirits to be free. Prayer, Shabbat, and any other ritual can easily be misdirected. The boundaries don't stifle religious expression, they direct it in the right direction.



### MOTZEI SHABBAT: FEB 26TH 7:00PM TO 8:00PM on ZOOM


