Torah on Tour

No Excuse to Embarrass Another

by Rabbi Jarrod Grover

"Say to Aaron and his sons: 'These are the regulations for the sin offering: The sin offering is to be slaughtered before the LORD in the place the burnt offering is slaughtered.'" (Leviticus 6:25)

Why the commandment to bring the sin offering to the place where the burnt offering is slaughtered? The Talmud answers: so as to save those who sinned from embarrassment. Sin offerings,

unlike burnt offerings, were brought exclusively by those who transgressed. When people saw the animal being brought, they purposefully would not know which offering it was.

A Jew should never cause their fellow to become embarrassed when they have done something wrong. Similarly, the saintly Chofetz Chaim, in his book on the laws of *lashon hara* (evil speech), teaches that a person listening to *lashon hara* should be careful not to rebuke his friend if there are others present. She should wait until later when they are alone to offer the rebuke.

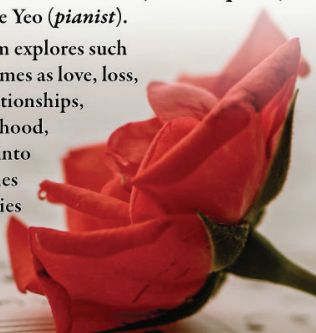

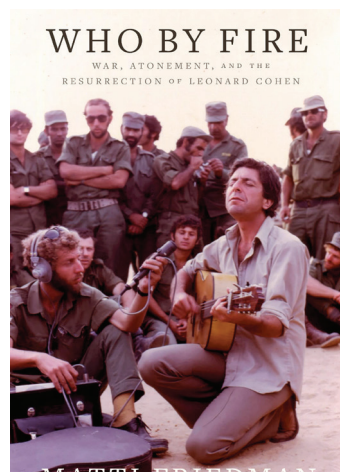

REOPENING UPDATE:

We are grateful and gratified to be able to make the following announcements related to the reopening of worship services at Beth Tikvah.

(1) We will host evening minḥa/ma'ariv services in-person from our sanctuary, including Kabbalat Shabbat and Shabbat Minḥa. Services will be Livestreamed, but please make an effort to join us and help make the minyan. Morning services will continue to be hosted on Zoom for the time-being.

(2) Beginning this Shabbat (Tzav - March 19th), we will be serving food at Shabbat morning kiddush, and a meal at seudah shlishit as well. All those who are comfortable staying to eat are welcome.

(3) Beginning this Shabbat (Tzav - March 19th), the Torah service will revert to the pre-pandemic normal with Ark openers, hakafot, gabbaim, and aliyot taken next to the reader, etc.

We look forward to sharing more positive announcements in the coming months. All our services are open to all, though we ask that you continue to register your attendance at Shabbat morning services.
