Torah on Tour

Hametz and the Fundamentals of Judaism by Rabbi Jarrod Grover

The prohibition against Hametz (leaven) on Passover is particularly stringent. The Torah not only prohibited the eating of Hametz but also added a prohibition against its possession. The Sages proceeded to add a prohibition against mixtures containing even the smallest amount of Hametz. In other words, our break with Hametz on Passover is of an absolute nature. The reason for this is that Hametz represents evil. According to the Zohar, Hametz stands for the evil inclination. Other sources explain that Hametz alludes to pride; Hametz causes the dough to rise, a trait which gives the impression of audacity and swelling of the physical, like the boasting of a

haughty person. Matzah, on the other hand, maintains its original size, as created by the Almighty.

Yet, this explanation presents some difficulty, because throughout the year Hametz is not seen to be evil, and there is no prohibition against eating it.

We can resolve this contradiction by distinguishing between two types of pride. The first type of pride resides in a person who makes a practice of praising himself, believing himself to be smarter, stronger, or more successful than he actually is. This sort of pride is undesirable all year long. The second type of pride - the type represented by Hametz on Passover - is displayed by

man toward his own Creator. Every Jew must recognize the fact that God created the world and that the sources of all things are dependent upon Him alone.

The Passover festival, especially Seder Night, was intended to implant in us the foundations of faith: that there is a Creator, and that He oversees His creation, and that He chose the Jewish people to be the ones to cause His name to be revealed in the world. Therefore, on Passover, the festival which is meant to implant in us faith in God, we have been commanded to be very careful about even the slightest amount of Hametz, for it represents the diminishing of God, and the denial of the foundations of Judaism.

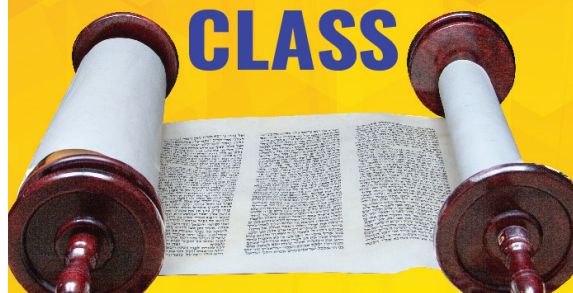

Misaskim Toronto has put out a call to collect 300 USED Talitot to be used for burial purposes (for community members who don't have their own Talit).

Since the Tzitzit are clipped off anyway, they need not be Kosher.

Similarly, the Beged is acceptable even if it's unclean or torn.

Many people come across old Talitot while cleaning for Pesah – this is a great way to give them one more important Mitzvah to do in their retirement.
