Light of the Torah

The Secret Code by Rabbi Alisa Zilbershtein

This week, we are reading Parshat Va'ethannan, the second Parsha in the book of Devarim. In this Parsha, we encounter the Shema, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone" (Deuteronomy 6:4). The Shema is our declaration of faith in God's oneness, reflecting the essence of Jewish monotheism.

But the Shema isn't just a prayer; it's also a call to action, and it became dramatically significant during World War II, one of the grimmest periods in history. In the throes of the Holocaust, when Jews were in danger for simply being Jews, the

Shema morphed into a secret code. Jewish children, hidden with non-Jewish families to protect them, often didn't know their own heritage. Their parents had made the agonizing decision to suppress their children's Jewish identity, hoping it would improve their chances of survival.

After the war, Jewish volunteers who sought to find these lost children would visit the homes where they were suspected to be hiding. They would whisper the words of the Shema, and some of these children recognized these words. For many, the Shema was their only connection to their Jewish identity. It was

more than a prayer; it was a lifeline, a whisper of their true identity, a call back to their people.

Shema. It is more than just a proclamation of faith. It's a call to our roots, a reminder of our community, and an affirmation of our resilience. Let's remember the power of the Shema. Not just as words we recite but as a language of connection, an enduring bond that unites us across time and place, reminding us who we are and where we belong.


As They Made Us
