# Light of the Torah

### **Find Your Ark**

Parshat Noah, a Torah portion that many of us know from a young age, is often simplified into a story of an ark, a flood, and a rainbow. Yet, as adults, we can appreciate the depth of a story that has much to offer in terms of hope and renewal.

In the story of Noah, we encounter a world gone astray, a society that has lost its moral compass. God decides to cleanse the Earth with a flood but chooses Noah, a "righteous man," to build an ark and preserve life. The floodwaters eventually recede, and life starts anew.

Noah invites us to shift our focus toward the potential for renewal and the promise of better days to come.

The ark can be seen as a symbol of shelter from life's storms. Just as Noah took refuge in the ark, so too can we find our own sources of refuge. Whether it's our community, our family, or our faith in God, these "arks" can help us weather the difficulties we face. Sometimes, simply knowing that you're not alone in your struggles can be comforting.
