Beth Tikvah Participates in Sefer Torah Dedication

Last week, the Toronto Jewish Community dedicated a Sefer Torah to the Paley Family of Jerusalem, on the first yahrzeit of their beloved children, Asher Menachem and Yaakov Yisrael, who were killed last February at a bus stop in Ramot on their way to a family simha. Asher was seven years old and Yaakov was five. The Sefer Torah campaign, funded through the generosity of many Beth Tikvah members, was organized by Rabbi Grover, Rabbi Zev Spitz (Clanton Park Synagogue) who visited the shiva house together last year. The event was attended by thousands of people, including some of the most prominent rabbis in Israel, and classmates of the boys who lined the street for a procession filled with singing and dancing.

What is Terumah? by Rabbi Alisa Zilbershtein

In this week's Parashat Terumah, we learn about a special request from God to the Israelites: to bring gifts for building a special place where God can be close to them. The Torah tells us, "Everyone whose heart feels inspired should bring a gift to God." (Exodus 25:2) This isn't just about giving physical things; it's also about what's in our hearts when we give.

Wise teaching from Hassidic master Elimelech of Lizhensk explains that there are two ways people can connect with God. Some people follow all the rules and do good deeds, and that's

a wonderful way to live. But there's another way, too. Some people put their whole heart and soul into their connection with God. They don't just do good deeds; they really feel the love and joy in doing them. They're so full of this love and joy that it's like they're already getting a taste of the World-to-Come right here on Earth.

The word "Terumah," which means the gifts people were asked to bring, literally means "uplifting." Thus, the verse is saying, "Strive to enjoy the light of My divine presence in your lifeuplift (Terumah) and take it from the World-to-Come." This teaching tells us that when we do things with love and joy, especially when we're connecting with God or helping others, we're lifting ourselves up; we're enhancing the world around us and making it a more sacred place.

So, this part of the Torah is really asking us to think about how we do things, not just what we do. It's saying that when we do things with a happy and loving heart, we feel closer to God and experience the ultimate fulfillment right here in this world.
