From Judgment to Mercy by Rabbi Alisa Zilbershtein

This week, in Parshat Vaera, we read Elokim is associated with justice, law, about the revelation of God's name Y-H- and the natural order. It's the name that V-H to Moshe.

"God spoke to Moses and said to him, "I am Y-H-V-H. I appeared to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob as El Shaddai, but I did not make Myself known to them by this name." (Ex 6:3) This revelation is not just about a name, but it signifies a deeper understanding of God's attributes and how God relates to the world.

In our tradition, the names of God are not just labels; they are windows into God's essence. We see two primary names of God in the Torah: Elokim and Y-H-V-H.

and the natural order. It's the name that reflects God's role as the creator and the upholder of the world's structure. When God acts as Elokim, the focus is on justice, righteousness, and the moral law.

In contrast, Y-H-V-H is a name that signifies mercy, compassion, and a deep connection with the human experience. It represents a God who is intimately involved in our lives, who understands our struggles and aspirations. The revelation of this name to Moshe signals a shift – from the God of justice to the God of mercy. It marks the beginning of a journey where the Israelites will


come to experience God not just as the creator and judge but as a redeemer and a compassionate caretaker.

As we navigate through our own turbulent times, we carry with us the hope to experience God's mercy in our lives. Just as the Israelites witnessed a shift from divine justice to divine mercy, we too yearn for moments of compassion and understanding in our world today. May we all be blessed to feel the presence of Y-H-V-H, the name that signifies kindness and mercy, guiding us through our challenges and leading us toward a future filled with peace and harmony.

In Commemoration of International Holocaust Remembrance Day


