Mindfulness session with Jason Weir,

300 years ago, there came to the New World a boat, and its name was the Mayflower. The Mayflower's landing on Plymouth Rock was one of the great historical events in the history of England and in the history of America. But I would like to ask any Englishman sitting here on the commission, what day did the Mayflower leave port? What date was it? I'd like to ask the Americans: do they know what date the Mayflower left port in England? How many people were on the boat? Who were their leaders? What kind of food did they eat on the boat?

More than 3300 years ago, long before the Mayflower, our people left Egypt, and every Jew in the world, wherever he is, knows what day they left. And he knows what food they ate. And we still eat that food every anniversary. And we know who our leader was. And we sit down and tell the story to our children and grandchildren in order to guarantee that it will never be forgotten. And we say our two

Turning Suffering into Love

The formative experience of the Jewish people is our having been vulnerable outsiders in the land of Egypt. In light of that experience, the Bible seeks to amplify our care and concern for the vulnerable outsider. We are taught not to oppress them, and more than that, to actively love them.

It's crucial for us to notice just how radical this commandment is. We could say that since we've suffered, we don't owe anything to anyone. Instead, we say that since we've suffered, we want to make sure no one else has to endure what we did.

What is true of the national story is true of our personal stories. There are few more powerful spiritual challenges than this one: Let your memory teach you empathy, and let your suffering teach you love. Pesa \underline{h} is not just about telling our national story. It is also about asking what life has taught us, and about whether we are willing to undertake the daunting task of learning to love the vulnerable among us.

This Pesah, may we merit to turn our suffering into love.





Yom Hashoah V'Hagvurah (Holocaust Remembrance Day) is designated by the State of Israel on the Hebrew date of 27 Nisan, which begins on the evening of May 1 and continues through the day of May 2. 
