# Torah Qu Tou

This week's Torah portion addresses the question of who serves in the Mishkan (Tabernacle). We are introduced to the concept of the Priesthood, as God designates Aaron as High Priest. Why is Aaron chosen to be High Priest and not Moses? Wasn't Moses the one who helped lead us out of Egypt?

The sage Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai tells us that the Priesthood originally belonged to Moses, but that he lost it in the first moments of his leadership career. When God gave Moses his assignment at the burning bush, Moses was argumentative and objected repeatedly. God was not impressed, and during the course of that conversation, transfers the power of the Priesthood to Aaron.

Research shows that we tend to make up our minds about someone in a matter of seconds. More than anything else, first impressions are the fundamental drivers of our relationships. Meeting new people often provokes discomfort, and nervousness, but nothing dims the hopes of a lasting relationship faster than pessimism and negativity. Moses may have been a prophet, but like the rest of us, he faced the consequences of never getting a second chance to make a good first impression. We should learn from his mistake.





Starting this Shabbat (February 16), Beth Tikvah will initiate a program that will help our shul become more environmentally responsible.










# **Monday Morning Learning with Rabbi Grover** Kontemporary Kohanim
