Sabbath Musing

With Rabbi Louis Sachs

i Tissa: Affirming Sinai

Just this week, Rabbi Grover and I had the pleasure of overseeing the conversion of 16 new members of the Jewish community. But new is not really the correct word, because the rabbis of the Talmud teach that the souls of every single Jew throughout history, even those who are Jews by choice, stood together at Mount Sinai to receive the Torah. This sentiment is reflected in the experience that so many of those who choose Judaism describe, of finally feeling at home.

In our parsha this week, our ancestors stood at the foot of the mountain and awaited Moses' return; growing impatient, they built a Golden calf to worship in place of God. After Moses begs God's forgiveness for the Israelites, one of the many commandments given is again a prohibition against idol worship, "You shall not make molten gods for yourselves."

The Hassidic Rebbe, Menechem Mendl of Kostk taught that this command was less about idolatry and more about theology. The values of societies shift over time, they bend and change like molten ore, but Judaism teaches us to focus on the things that matter most in life. Too many of us give up, we grow impatient, waiting for the reward of living our lives according to the wisdom of our tradition. We build idols of our work, our social status, our bank accounts, and more, shifting our focus from living each day with values of family, community, and holiness. This past week, I watched 16 individuals who stood there alongside us at Mount Sinai, re-affirm their commitment to God, Torah, and being a part of Am Yisrael. Maybe it is time the rest of us who stood at Mount Sinai do that too? - RLS




