## Terumah: God Beyond Words

Our parsha this week describes the two cherubim, golden angels, which adorned the ancient Ark. The Jewish philosopher, Philo of Alexandria, who lived in the Roman province of Egypt during the first century, taught that each of these represented a different aspect of God nature. One cherub, represented God's qualities of mercy and beneficence, and the other, God's attribute of justice and law. But as he notes, God's voice was heard from the space between the two, neither quality represented a larger part of the Divine than the other.

In our morning prayers we recite, "ha-El, ha-Av, ha-Rachaman," (the God, the father, and the Merciful,) again recognizing that in different moments we relate to God in different ways, no single word can encompass the Divine more than another. Throughout our lives we each relate to God in different ways. There are moments when God may feel like a parent, or a friend, and there are difficult moments when God may even seem like an adversary.

In all these moments it is important to remember the lesson of Philo, that no single quality does justice to God's infinite nature. No single word in any human language can capture the multitude of diverse ways we can each connect to the Divine presence.

There are moments when language limits our ability to connect to the Divine, because the attribute we want may not be the one we find, it is in those moments we must seek God not with words, but with our spirit. - RLS


## WHAT'S NOW
