# Sabbath Musings With Rabbi Louis Sachs

### Darsha Vayikra: Un-Guilty by Association

Our parsha this week, we learn about the different sacrifices a person must bring for atonement. What is particularly interesting, however, is the language that is used. When talking about community the Torah states, "If the whole congregation of Israel shall err..." Similarly, when talking about the priest, the Torah states, "If the anointed priest shall sin..." Both of these examples are conditional, they are remedies to be used only if necessary. In case the community, or the priest sins, this is how that act can be atoned for.

What is interesting is when our parsha discusses a leader sinning, there the text says, "When a ruler sins..." In this case, it seems not that it is a possibility, but rather a certainty that they will. In the Zohar, Rabbi Yitzhak teaches that in a community, some may sin, but others likely will not. They will teach and learn from each other how to be better, making it very unlikely that everyone will sin.

Similarly, a priest, who is focused on serving God, is also unlikely to sin. But a ruler, someone who is not focused on God, and who views themselves as being above the community, and not a apart from it. They are not focused on serving a cause bigger than themselves, and they do not have others to help guide them in their actions. For such a person, it is not a question of if, but rather, when.

The lesson for each of us is that we need both, one another, and a cause bigger than ourselves to be the best versions of who we can be. It is through community and God that we can raise ourselves up, and hopefully avoid the need for a guilt offering at all. -RLS

The Beth Tikvah Connects (<u>Hesed</u>) Committee is aware that there are members of the congregation who are experiencing various degrees of memory and cognitive



Kathy speaks to children in schools and libraries around the world about the importance of understanding the Holocaust and keeping its memory alive.


