About a hundred years ago in Poland, Rabbi Meir Shapiro zt"l, the head of the Lublin Yeshiva, sent a messenger to the Hafetz Hayim of Radin, Rabbi Israel Meir Kagan zt"l, the most important rabbi in the Ashkenazi world at the time. He notified him that he would be spending Shabbat in Radin, and requested an invitation to have Shabbat dinner at his home. The Hafetz Hayim replied that it would be a distinct honour to have such a distinguished and renowned Torah scholar as a guest at his table.

The messenger then returned with a special request from Rabbi Shapiro stating that he would feel mor comfortable if the women would partake of the meal at a separate table or in the kitchen. Could the Hafetz Hayim accommodate him?

The Hafetz Hayim replied that, regrettably, he would not be able to make that arrangement and would have to withdraw the invitation. "I believe," he said, "that Jewish law requires every husband to eat the Shabbat meal with his wife and family, and I cannot ask my wife to eat alone."

Acts of loving-kindness, charity, and compassion, are paramount in Judaism. But they should never come at the expense of one's family.


