

Darsha Shimini: Kashrut Cares About Your Feelings

This week, Israel's chief Sephardi Rabbi, Rabbi Yitzchak Yosef put a last minute hold on publishing the annual Passover kashrut guide produced by the Rabbinate. He was upset that the authors had made it overly stringent and burdensome, explaining, "They followed the rule of 'the more stringent the better,' and made up many, many chumrot (stringent rules)." He further complained, "They are looking to make matters more stringent for the people of Israel..."

In doing so, Rav Yosef, upheld a very important principle in Jewish law, of not placing an excessive burden on a community, (tircha d'tzibur.) The Rabbinic Sages of the Talmud, understood that halakhah was meant to uplift our lives, and not to make them excessively difficult to live.

In our parsha, we find this week the foundations for kashrut, the laws of which animals are permitted to eat and which are not. The rabbis of the Talmud developed these laws into the complex system we have today, but they never lost sight of their purpose. Kashrut, like every other mitzvah, is meant to help bring us close to God. Living a Jewish life is not easy, it takes commitment, but too many today forget that it is not meant to be unduly difficult.

Today, we hear the phrase, "facts don't care about your feelings." Regardless of that truth, Jewish law does. Or as my teacher Rabbi Elliot Dorff always taught us, "the kashrut of a chicken, is not just about the chicken." The person inquiring about its status is just as important to the question. If you forbid it, will they have food on their table for dinner? That is the real question. That is the essence of the halakhic process. - RLS
