Va'era: Now Is The Time To Be Free

There is a question often asked about the Exodus story, why did God choose that moment in time to free the Israelites from slavery? Why not earlier or later?

The \underline{h} asidic polish leader, Rabbi Simcha Bunim, offers an answer playing on the similar sounds of the Hebrew words "burdens," (slivot) and "patience," (savlanut). Rabbi Bunim teaches that God was afraid the Israelites were becoming too patient with the burdens of Egypt. If they were to remain slaves any longer, they would be so used to life in captivity that they could not adjust to a life of freedom.

As we approach the new year, this lesson can serve as a reminder that it is really easy to get trapped in a routine. Humans have a remarkable capacity to accept what is, as what has to be.

Use this Shabbat as a chance to reflect on the past year. Are you the person you want to be? Are your relationships as meaningful as you'd like? Is your connection to God and the Jewish people as strong as you wish it were?

If the answer to any of these questions is is no, then now is the time to change. Before you become too patient with your own captivity, the new year is a chance to grow; it is time to be free.


