Swimming Against the Tide


Rabbi Menachem Nachum of Chernobyl asserts that the celebration of Hanukkah was prophetically foreseen by Joseph. In Parashat Mikkets, Joseph gives a special wish to Benjamin when he was brought to Egypt, "Elokim yohnekha beni" - "God shall grant you favor, my son" (43:29). The final three letters of the word "yohnekha" are h.n.kh – the root of the word "Hanukkah."

What connection might there be between Hanukkah and the story of Joseph and Benjamin's reunion in Egypt?

Joseph's special affection for Benjamin stemmed not only from his being Joseph's only full brother, but also from Benjamin being the only brother who did not participate in the sale of Joseph as a slave. Benjamin represents the dissenting minority, the individual who refuses to be led astray by the majority. He serves as the symbol for those heroic figures who have the courage to swim against the tide and who listen to their conscience instead of their peers.

Thus the Rabbi of Chernobyl pointed to Benjamin as an early symbol of the struggle waged by the Hasmoneans who resisted Hellenism and heroically upheld Jewish beliefs and practices. Like Benjamin, they were the small "jug" that remained "pure" when the rest was "defiled."

This teaches us that we must remain true to our principles even when they are unpopular, and muster the strength, courage and confidence to do the right thing even when the majority of the people around us aren't.

GREETINGS FROM THE RITUAL COMMITTEE


