Musings

With Rabbi Louis Sachs

oaves from Heaven and Earth

On Shabbat we recite haMotzi over two loaves of bread in remembrance of the double portion of manna the Israelites received while journeying in the desert. The Sefat Emet, a Hasidic rebbe from the second half of the 19th century, offers us a deeper understanding of this custom.

He teaches that the manna, which is first given in our parasha this week, was the food of the angels, and that it is represented by one of the loaves at our Sabbath table. The second loaf represents the "bread of the Earth." One loaf symbolizes redemption from the Heavens, and other from the Earth. Together, the two loaves remind us that the work of salvation must be done in both directions.

We are directed to rest on the seventh day, but that verse is preceded by the charge to work during the other six. On Shabbat we rest, and we nurture our spiritual selves, bringing the divine realm a little bit closer to the Earth. We also nurture our physical self, so that during the week to come, we can help raise the Earth a little bit closer to the Heavens. Just as our Shabbat table is incomplete without both loaves, our Sabbath rest is incomplete without the task that follows. - RLS



When the women's balcony in an Orthodox synagogue in Jerusalem collapses, leaving the rabbi's wife in a coma and the rabbi in shock , the congregation falls into crisis. Charismatic young Rabbi David appears to be a savior after the accident, but slowly starts pushing his fundamentalist ways and tries to take control.

Behind the Music: Shabbat Shirah

How very fitting that on Shabbat Shirah, the Sabbath of Song, the pieces sung by the choir today are entirely the compositions of Srul Irving Glick Zhl. We were so fortunate to have as our own composer in residence, this man whose music reflected deep spirituality. Srul's gift of composition, brought us the music that touches our souls. Some of the works that



the choir sings were also written for instruments and are often played on the radio. Srul came to Beth Tikvah in 1969, and he composed and conducted for the Beth Tikvah choir and the cantor until just before his untimely passing in 2002. Tibor Kovari's and Alexander Veprinskiy's interpretations of these beautiful pieces continue to enrich our musical tradition at Beth Tikvah.

This Shabbat is called Shabbat Shirah because in the parsha of Beshalach the Israelites sing a joyous song in praise of God after the parting of the Red Sea. This song is an expression of faith and is beloved to Israel; so much so, that the song is chanted daily in the prayer service. Some Rabbis also encourage the feeding of the birds at this time to acknowledge the birds' singing in praise of God. All over the world, Jews are celebrating Shabbat Shirah. Enjoy the beautiful music in our service today. After services, please join us for Kiddush co-sponsored by Musica Beth Tikvah.


