A Message From The Rabbi...

Engaging with the Torah

If I asked you to summarize the Great Rebuke that concludes the book of Vayikra, you would probably say: "God threatens us with punishment if we fail to observe the commandments." If we look more closely, however, we find that the spiritual decline addressed by the *Tochacha* is much more nuanced.

God states that we will incur the punishments of the *Tochacha* if the Jewish people will "not listen to me, and will not do all these commandments." The Sifra points out that this seems redundant. If we don't do the *mitzvot*, isn't it obvious that we fail to listen to God?

Chazal answer that not "listening" to God is actually an independent infraction—a failure to toil in Torah study. In other words, simply performing the commandments is insufficient. We must work to understand and think about the commandments.

Neglecting to study, understand, and apply the Torah constitutes a failure to **listen** to God. The way God speaks to us and instructs us on how to live our lives and connect with Him is through the Torah. Thoughtless, study-less observance will necessarily result in our failure to hear what God has to say at critical junctures. If we treat halacha as something we do because we're used to it, we will not be able to truly connect to it as an all-encompassing system for life.

One of the ways that we can assess our own level of engagement with the Torah is where we place our emphasis and values. If we place a greater value on fashion than modesty, on attending an Ivy League school than succeeding in Torah study, and on secular values rather than being light to the nations, we need to step back and re-engage, re-toil in the Torah, put our own biases aside and really listen to what it has to say.

Failure to heed the *Tochacha's* exhortation to engage can only result, 1"\pi, in lengthening the exile it foretells. As we think about our recent reacceptance of the Torah on Shavuos, let us truly internalize the fact that in order to fully live a Jewish life, we need to put (figurative) sweat and tears into applying the Torah to all facets of our lives.


