A Message From The Rabbi...

Blessings After Eating: The Key to Much More?

rawing on the parallel between עקב meaning 'consequently' and meaning 'heel,' Rashi comments at the beginning of Parshas Eikev that the rewards promised at the beginning of the Parsha will come when we obey המצות הקלות שאדם דש בעקביו, the "light" mitzvos that we trample underfoot.

One common example is actually found in Parshas Eikev: the mitzvah to bless God after meals ואכלת ושבעת וברכת את ה' אלדיך. While most people don't neglect to bentch after eating bread, we often rush through it with little concentration. An even worse problem lies with the other after-brachos, בורא נפשות and בורא נפשות, which can easily slip our minds entirely.

While prima facie this does indeed seem like a minor infraction, Psikta Zutarta, an early medieval Midrashic collection, has a different idea. It notes that the verse ordaining grace after meals is immediately followed by: השמר לך פן תשכח את ה' אלדיך "Take care lest thou forget the Lord thy God." Neglecting to say blessings after eating, or perhaps even saying them without paying attention, is not just a memory lapse but a form of casting off the yoke of heaven.

I think the reason that the Psikta judges this infraction so harshly is because right after the command to bentch, the Torah warns us that living in peace and material comfort may lead us to take our lives for granted. This is similar to eating: It is easy to be careful to make the blessing before partaking because we feel a lack – we are hungry and feel the desire for the food in front of us. Once we are finished and our hunger assuaged, we are less likely to make a point of realizing that it was ultimately God who provided us with the food. Taking care to make the proper blessing after eating trains us to remember that our comfort in all areas of life is due to Divine grace.

Being more careful to make all the appropriate blessings after eating, slowly and with understanding, is an excellent way to lead up to the High Holy Day season. If we demonstrate that we recognize God's role in our sustenance, God will hopefully have no reason to disturb the relative tranquility of our current existence in order to jolt us into not taking it for granted. We can thus merit a good judgment for the upcoming year.
