A Message From The Rabbi ...

"Chanukah: A Time to Ponder the Pew Report?"

hanukah, a holiday that celebrates the religious triumph of the Jewish people, is a good time to ponder the relationships between Jews and non-Jews in the world today. One issue that is a major focus of the larger Jewish community today is one of the most extreme manifestations of these: intermarriage. We in the Orthodox community can be somewhat smug about this – after all, this problem is thankfully not so common in our communities.

However, this apathy is misguided. We recently read Parshat Vayishlach, which has one of the most striking examples in the Torah of what one might call a potential intermarriage (although the term is somewhat anachronistic). Dinah, the daughter of our forefather Jacob, is raped by Shechem, who suggests total intermarriage between his people and the Israelites.

How could such a tragic incident have afflicted our great forefather's family? It wasn't because Dinah was flirting with the local boys or actually wanted to intermarry. The Torah tells us 'Dinah, daughter of Leah went out... to check out the girls of the land.' She wanted only to hang out with the girls – a seemingly innocuous display of interest in the local culture. We see, however, that excessive focus on the outside world can lead to a very slippery slope.

Most Orthodox singles feel safe that they will never intermarry. Nevertheless, the struggle against intermarriage does not start there. We may keep mitzvos, but if we follow Dinah's example and we are more enamored with secular culture than with Torah, this could lead some of our descendants on a path to intermarriage 5"7.

As we look at the striking Chanukah lights, let us let them remind us of the beauty of the Torah-true lifestyle which won out over Hellenization. We must teach our children that, while some forays into secular culture are okay, we must display to them how uplifting an authentic Jewish lifestyle is. We must cultivate a genuine, overarching desire to serve God that dwarfs other, outside interests. It is our duty in the Orthodox community to address the underlying root cause of intermarriage. This stands a better chance at being effective than waiting to address the problem itself.
