#### A Message From The Rabbi ...

#### "Facing Challenges"

or the most part, Judaism does not officially judge people based on their background and ancestry. For example, Shmaya and Avtalyon, two of the greatest Tannaim, were converts, and R' Akiva was a 'Baal Teshuvah.' Therefore, it should come as a surprise that our Parsha proscribes Amonites and Moabites from ever joining the Jewish people. Perhaps it is to assuage this surprise that the Torah, unlike its usual practice, feels the need to explain the reason for this mitzvah: "Because they did not greet you with bread and water on your way out of Egypt."

But why was this so bad? In fact, we didn't even really need their help! During the period of the desert, God provided us with food and water.

The Beis Yosef explains that the fact that they didn't even offer their help was a reflection of their extremely poor character on a national level. This prevents them from joining the Jewish people because the very nation represents lack of concern for others, which is the very antithesis of what the Jewish people stand for.

We should bear this in mind when contemplating our behavior as born or current Jews. If we don't even allow converts from such a nation because their principles are so repugnant, what does it say about us if we fail to devote ourselves to performing acts of kindness to others?

The Torah chides the Amonites and Moabites for failing to "greet us" with bread and water, not just their failure to provide it. We must fulfill one of our main roles in life as Jews not just by grudgingly acceding to requests for help, but we must try to discern in advance what people need and offer it.

May our resolve to increase our kindness to others be a merit to us to be inscribed in the book of life this Rosh Hashana.
