How could Lavan possibly lie so blatantly by claiming that the all the flock that were present belonged to him, even though it was Yaakov who managed to produce them through Hashem's blessing?

The Taz, in Hilchot Hanukah, quotes the Zohar in stating that HaKadosh Baruch Hu will not perform a miracle of blessing except using things that are already existent. Even if it's something small and minute, only then can God create "much from little." However, if something is totally lacking then the miracle wouldn't occur. (He wrote this in regards to the miracle of the oil of Hanukah. According to him, even the first night, there still remained some oil and this was necessary in order for Hashem to miraculously produce more oil for each remaining night. If there was no oil left, it wouldn't have been possible).

This was Lavan's claim. "While indeed it is correct that Hashem blessed you with increased livestock and sheep, it started because I had given you some of my own. You, Yaakov, came empty handed and I started you by providing you with a few sheep and cattle. Only after that, did Hashem bless you. Therefore, the sheep is mine and everything you see is mine, too."

To this, Yaakov had no response.
