Enhance Your Shovavim Observance with TAG

This week we enter the auspicious period known as Shovavim, which has traditionally been associated with introspection, reviewing the laws pertaining to the sanctity of a Jewish marriage, strengthening one's kedusha or holiness, and guarding one's eyes from inappropriate or forbidden material. In that light, we continue our conversation with **Rabbi Yisrael Tesser**, Director of the TAG-Arizona office, about installing technology filters to help guard our eyes.

Rabbi Tesser, what might I expect with a filter on my phone or computer? *The filters are fully customizable, and you choose what fits your family's needs. You might choose to install a "clean page" filter, which limits suggested videos to only those that match your precise search terms. Or you might choose to activate the time limit settings, which limit the length of time or time of day that one can use a device.*



OK, I'm in! How do I go about putting on a filter? *The process is quite simple for most devices, and we're happy to help you. At this time our Phoenix office is available by appointment only. You can reach us at **480.369.6988** (no texts please). We will iy"H celebrate a "grand opening" soon and also have our "mobile TAG" in Scottsdale!*

What does a TAG appointment look like? *In most situations, you will be sent a link to*

set up a filter account, which takes just a minute to do. Next, our volunteers will go through the settings to help you customize everything to your comfort level. Know that your privacy is a priority for us. We can't see what's on your computer, nor can we see the websites that you access.

Are masks required during appointments?

We want everyone to be comfortable. We can do indoor appointments with a mask, outdoor appointments, and in some cases, we may even be able to install remotely.

Is there a charge? *TAG does not charge for any of its services. However, the filter companies have invested millions of dollars in their products, and they do charge a fee.*

So, what will it cost me? *The average filter costs about \$10/month, which includes tech support. TAG-Arizona has a generous sponsor who helps defer some of those costs.*

Aren't there free filters online?

Why would I pay for one? *It has been proven time and again that free filters don't work. They are ineffective, inconsistent and unreliable. More importantly a child can easily bypass most filters available to the public (a simple online search is usually all it takes). The free filters don't meet the high standards of the Frum community.*
