A Practical Guide to Proper Observance of the Three Weeks

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Part one: Haircuts and Shaving

- 1) Ashkenazic custom prohibits taking haircuts from sunset on the 17th of Tammuz until after the 9th of Av^x. This year that is from sunset on July 19th until dusk on August 11th.
- 2) Many Sefardim have various differing customs regarding when to prohibit haircuts. They should consult a Ray.
- 3) It is permitted to trim one's mustache or beard that interferes with or gets dirty while eating or drinking.
- 4) Combing is permitted even though some hair will inevitably fall out^a.
- 5) It is customary to avoid giving haircuts even to very young children.
- 6) It is therefore proper for a child whose *upsherin* (the custom to give a boy his first haircut on his third birthday) falls during this time to hold it either before or after this period[†].
