Information-at-a-Glance

Location, Security and Staff

All socially-distanced programming will take place indoors at **13402 N Scottsdale Rd, Scottsdale**. The main minyan will take place in an expanded location across the parking lot from Ahavas Torah in **Suite #120**. Children's Story Time and Shofar blowing will take place on the Second Day of Rosh Hashana at Ahavas Torah (**Suite #B140-150**). We will have the benefit of the services of off-duty police, paid staff and volunteers dedicated to making your Yom Tov experience great.

Main Minyan Leadership

Under the leadership of Rabbi Shoshan, services will primarily be led by Rabbi Elimelech Adler, Rabbi Leib Bolel, Rabbi Shraga Yankelewitz, and R' Chaim Zimmerman with shofar blowing by Rabbi Eli Putney.

NEW – Seating

Ample seating is available for all who are planning to attend, including adults and children who are old enough to daven in-place with their parents. In order to maintain safe social distancing, specific seats will be assigned with spacing between households, and all are asked to stay at their seats throughout davening. Limited space will be available for walk-ins. **Please do not assume that we know you are coming. We encourage you to finalize your shul membership or guest fees in advance.**

NEW – Social Distancing

In order to limit the spread of COVID-19, masks must be worn over the mouth and nose at all times. **Please bring your own mask.** Distance of 6 feet from others who are not part of your household or group is required at all times. We ask that there be no handshaking and no congregating in the lobby or just outside the door. No consumption of food or drink is allowed inside the building at any time, and no water will be provided. Machzorim are available for use, but we request that they, Sifrei Torah, and mezuzos not be kissed. Social distancing measures will be observed during all honors (including opening and closing of the aron, aliyahs, hagba and gelila, etc). Restrooms may be used. Attendance is not permitted for anyone with a fever of 100 degrees or higher or experiencing other symptoms of COVID-19.

NEW – Community Shofar Blowing

Outdoor Shofar blowing for the benefit of those who cannot attend one of our minyanim will take place in the community on the Second Day of Rosh Hashana at 5:00 PM at the following two locations in Scottsdale:

- Corner of 70th St. and E. Friess Drive
- Corner of 67th St. and E. Jean Drive

Children's Programming

We are unable to offer child care and babysitting this year due to COVID-19 concerns. However, we are pleased to offer an indoor children's story time with R' Chaim Zimmerman and shofar blowing on the Second Day of Rosh Hashana at 1:00 pm at Ahavas Torah (Suite #B140-150). Those who attend must be masked and maintain 6 feet distance from other families. Parents will be responsible for their own children. Note: children who are old enough to stay at their seat with their parent are welcome to attend the main minyan.
