



Laws Regarding Rain on the First Night of Sukkot prepared by Rabbi Yechezkel Freundlich

On the first night of Sukkot there is a positive commandment to eat in the sukkah, in distinction to the remaining nights of Sukkot when one is not required to eat in the sukkah. For the remaining nights, if one desires to eat a meal of significance, it also must be done in a sukkah. The issue of rain on the first night is therefore dealt with differently in halacha than on subsequent nights.

In the event of rain on the first night of Sukkot, one should ideally wait approximately one hour in the hope of being able to eat in the sukkah, unless this will greatly affect one's positive experience of Yom Tov or there are children or guests who are not able to wait. If it continues to rain after an hour, one is to enter the sukkah to recite Kiddush with the "Shehechiyanu" blessing, and eat at least a kazayis - olive's volume - of bread in the rain. One does not recite the blessing of "leishev baSukkah," the blessing over the mitzvah of dwelling in a sukkah. After eating the bread, one may retire to the house to complete the meal. Because the mitzvah of eating in a (dry) sukkah has not yet been fulfilled, if it stops raining at any point, either during the meal or even if the meal has been concluded already, one should enter the sukkah again, say the bracha of "leishev baSukkah," and eat at least a k'beitza which is the volume of an egg, or approximately one whole slice of challah.

On all remaining nights of Sukkot, if it is raining when one is ready to begin the meal, one may eat the entire meal inside and need not return outside even if it later stops raining.


