#### **Outside the Camp**

It took two years and approximately seventeen days since the first COVID-19 lockdown in Quebec. It may have been inevitable - but I finally contracted the virus. To quote words from the Torah that I will hopefully read publicly in the synagogue this coming Shabbos, I have been מחוץ למחנה - outside the camp - for the past week. Ironically, this happened to me, a Ba'al Koreh - a Torah reader, in the middle of the reading of the two juxtaposed Torah portions of Tazria-Metzora which deal with a person needing quarantine and isolation. It seems that these two Torah portions are appropriately placed in time, as the sixth wave of this miserable, global, viral affliction escalates.

As a means of curing sickness, isolation is not new to Judaism. In the Torah portions of Tazria-Metzora we read that if someone believed they had contracted *tzaraat*, there was a process of testing, quarantine, isolation, and healing. First, the afflicted would see the Kohen to be examined. If the Kohen suspected that the symptoms were there, he would quarantine the afflicted person at home. After seven days, there was a recheck to see if the results were negative. If the afflicted "tested" positive, he was sent outside the camp for a period of isolation, until cured. Does this sound familiar?

But what kind of disease is *tzaraat*? Is it like Covid? Highly contagious with the potential to cause life-threatening illness and death? Not exactly. The rabbis interpret *tzaraat* as being a physical manifestation of a spiritual illness - the illness of speaking evil of others. Why quarantine a person for speaking evil? The Talmud (Arachin 16b) explains that when people speak slanderously of others, they end up separating people - spouses, friends, and colleagues - from one another. Therefore, separating such slanderers from society is making the punishment fit the crime. Just as they separated others, so too they must be separated through social distancing.

We learn that a person who suffers from *Tsaraat* is called a מצורע - metzora. The Midrash cites a powerful verse from the Book of Proverbs which speaks about the power of speech: *Death and life are in the hands of the tongue and they that love it shall eat it's fruit.* (Proverbs 18:21)

We learned from this verse that one who uses their tongue in a positive way and speaks words of Torah will be rewarded while one who brings evil through his tongue with slander and gossip will bring upon himself sorrow and the punishment of tzara'at and become a metzora - מצורע. The Midrash sees this word as a contraction of two words: מציא-רע - A person who is afflicted because he has spoken ill of others.

A portion of the sacrifice that the cured *metzora* brings is a sacrifice of two birds. Hashem commanded to bring the birds because the nature of birds is to sing and chirp with their mouths and this atones for the evil which the metzora's mouth spoke.

We have painfully learned that Covid is contagious. In a Shabbos AJC blog, L. S. Frank describes slander, gossip and *lashon hara* as one of the most contagious diseases. Our sages suggest that it has the power to kill three parties: the speaker, the listener, and the subject of the gossip. But when you harm an individual's reputation, that 'innocuous comment' can also spread to their material possessions, their jobs, homes, and other tangibles. A wounded reputation leads to serious financial loss, affecting them and their families, and it is difficult and, at times, impossible to undo the damage done.

This is illustrated in the following famous story:

There was a nice gentleman in town who lived to tell stories. One day this gentleman found out something really weird (but true) about another businessman in town. Of course he felt compelled to share what he knew with his colleagues, who told it to their friends, who told it to people they knew, who told it to their wives, who spoke with their friends and their neighbours. It went around town and the unhappy businessman who was the main character in the story heard it. He ran to the rabbi of the town, and wailed and complained that he was ruined! Nobody would like to deal with him after this. His good name and his reputation were gone with the wind.

Now this rabbi knew his customers, so to speak, and he decided to summon the man who loved to tell stories. If he was not the one who started them, he might at least know who did. When the nice man heard from the rabbi how devastated his colleague was, he felt truly sorry. He honestly had not considered it such a big deal to tell this story, because it was true; the rabbi could check it out if he wanted. The rabbi sighed and said: "True, not true, that really makes no difference! You just cannot tell stories about people. This is all lashon hara, slander, and it's like murder—you kill a person's reputation." He said a lot more, and the man who started the rumour now felt really bad and sorry. "What can I do to make it undone?" he sobbed. "I will do anything you say!" The rabbi looked at him. "Do you have any feather pillows in your house?" The man answered: "Rabbi, I am not poor; I have a whole bunch of them. But what do you want me to do, sell them?" The rabbi replied: "No, just bring me one."

The man was mystified, but he returned a bit later to the rabbi's study with a nice fluffy pillow under his arm. The rabbi opened the window and handed him a knife. "Cut it open!" "But Rabbi, here in your study? It will make a mess!" "Do as I say!" The man cut the pillow. A cloud of feathers came out. They landed on the chairs and on the bookcase, on the clock, on the cat which jumped after them. They floated over the table and into the teacups, on the rabbi and on the man with the knife, and a lot of them flew out of the window in a big swirling, whirling trail.

The rabbi waited ten minutes. Then he ordered the man: "Now bring me back all the feathers, and stuff them back in your pillow. All of them, mind you. Not one may be missing!" The man stared at the rabbi in disbelief. "That is impossible, Rabbi. The ones here in the room I might get, most of them, but the ones that flew out of the window are gone. Rabbi, I can't do that, you know it!" "Yes," said the rabbi and nodded gravely, "that is how it is: once a rumor, a gossipy story, a 'secret,' leaves your mouth, you do not know where it ends up. It flies on the wings of the wind, and you can never get it back!"

He ordered the man to deeply apologize to the person about whom he had spread the rumor; that is difficult and painful, but it was the least he could do. He ordered him to apologize to the people to whom he had told the story, making them accomplices in the nasty *lashon hara* game, and he ordered him to diligently study the laws concerning lashon hara every day for a year, and then come back to him.

As we continue to struggle with the pandemic, we recognize that one element of our parsha hits closer to home in its contemporary connection than ever before: just as someone can bring down the health of the community by spreading a lethal virus, so too can one who spreads evil gossip cause severe damage to the health of our community.


