



A SHABBOS MESSAGE FROM REVEREND AMIEL BENDER

We Have Returned - אנחנו נצבים

אתם נצבים היום כלכם לפני ה' אלהיכם ראשיכם שבטיכם זקניכם ושטריכם כל איש ישראל; טפכם נשיכם וגרך אשר בקרב מחניך מחטב עציך עד שאב מימיך;

You are standing here today, all of you, before Hashem your G-d: the heads of your tribes, your elders, and your officers - all the men of Israel; Your small children, your women and your proselyte who is in the midst of your camp, from the hewer of your wood to the drawer of your water;

Devarim 29:9-10

It was the last day of Moshe Rabeinu's life, though many of those assembled may not have known it. Moshe brought the nation, Bnei Yisrael together, from the most exalted to the simplest among them, old and young, men and women, and for the last time initiated them into the covenant of Hashem.

The various strata of the population are enumerated: the leaders, the elders, the officers, the men, the small children, the women, and the proselytes, down to the hewer of wood and the drawer of water. The question arises: Since the text already stated, all of you, why would the Torah find it necessary to mention each group separately? Surely, they fall under the words all of you. As every word in the Torah is significant, why this redundancy?

The answer to this question is an important one, particularly with the oncoming High Holy Days season where we not only pray for ourselves, but for those around us and in general for Klal Yisrael. In this covenant Moshe introduced the idea of ערבות - communal responsibility. We are all responsible for each other. The Jewish people are like one body, and our destiny is intertwined. While this may be interpreted on many levels, the Art Scroll commentary writes about the importance of Moshe's message on a spiritual level which lends itself to the collective holiness of our nation: Every Jew is obligated to help others to observe the Torah and to restrain them from violating it.

Rabbi Mordechai Eliyahu (1929-2010) wrote that these words in the Torah portion of Nitzavim which is read before the High Holidays are a hint that we will soon be standing before Hashem in judgement. Rebbetzin Esther Jungreis (1936-2016) wrote that The stirring opening words - שאתם נצבים היום בלבם לפני ה' אלהיבה - "You are standing today, all of you, before Hashem, your G-d" speak volumes. She noted, that in gematria - Hebrew numerology - these words are the equivalent of חושלים לעמוד לסליחות for stand before Hashem and seek forgiveness. Jungreis's reflections on these words continued: During the entire year we run from place to place, from activity to activity, and some of us run so fast that we forget why we are running, what our lives are all about. But now, G-d's Day of Judgment is upon us, and we are commanded to stand still, probe our souls, examine our hearts, and give an accounting of our lives.

The children of Israel were out in force to hear Moshe Rabeinu and this impressive gathering must have been a momentous event. I for one, would have loved to be there and would have gone early to reserve a choice spot at the front of the assembly. I would proudly tell my grandchildren that I was there, and that

I heard the words from Moshe's mouth! In Hollywood terms, we see an older man of 120 with a long white beard, holding his famous and precious staff, on an upraised platform or boulder, speaking as loud as he can as he addresses the masses standing before him. Moshe spoke to everyone as equals, with every word, loud and clear, the same words to everyone, regardless of his or her standing in the diverse crowd. They were his nation, his flock, his concern and he was leading them into the post era following his passing.

The Maor Vashemesh, Rabbi Kalonymus Kalman Epstein (1753-1825) wrote that the verse opens in the plural sense - אתם and ends in the singular - איש ישראל. This teaches us about אהבת - proper conduct, respect and love for one another. There are tiered levels mentioned among the people, yet everyone is equal and no one person sees him or herself as higher or more important than the other.

Our sages expound on the idea of equality among our people:

The Talmud (Pesachim 50a) tells the story of Rav Yosef the son of Rabbi Joshua ben Levi, who fell ill and was at the brink of death when his father's prayers brought him back to life. When he came to, his father asked him: "My son, what did you see (in heaven)?" Rav Yosef replied: "I saw an upside-down world. Those who are on top here are on the bottom there; and those who are here regarded as lowly are exalted in heaven." Rav Moshe Alshich (1508-1553) wrote: That the leader or the sage is superior to the wood-hewer, or the watercarrier is only from our earthbound perspective, which sees a "hierarchy" of roles. But when "you all stand before G-d," there is no higher and lower—what seems "low" here is no less lofty and significant in G-d's eyes. Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Liadi, the first Lubavitcher Rebbe (1745-1812) wrote: Like the various organs and limbs of a body, each of which complements, serves and fulfills all the others, so too the Jewish people: the simple "wood-hewer" or "water-carrier" contributes something to each and every one of his fellow Jews, including the most exalted "head."

We are at a special time in our year. In a few days we will all be נצבים - we will all be standing together before Hashem in prayer. Our TBDJ High Holiday minyanim, which were compromised in numbers and venues during the terrible pandemic have filled up nicely with so many eagerly returning to Shul. True, the pandemic High Holiday prayer arrangements were unique and special as davening in the tents and parks was different and to a certain extent I dare say, even rewarding, in many ways. We have Baruch Hashem merited to return to Shul and there is something special about standing before Hashem as a community in Shul where we belong, as we envision our families and our TBDJ family around us, in multitudes, engrossed in prayer. השיבנו ה' אליך ונשובה - Bring back to you Hashem and we shall return... • We have returned...
