Paul Hirschson grew up in Johannesburg. He holds bachelor degrees in accounting and law, and a master's degree in business. After immigrating to Israel, Paul served in the IDF then worked in the public sector, relocating to England for three years. On his return to Israel, he entered Israel's hi-tech industry, and in the next ten years, he developed successful relations in Arab countries and later in Europe, Africa and beyond. In 2004, Paul joined the Foreign Ministry, becoming Israel's first diplomat posted to the United Arab Emirates, 15 years before the ties became public. In 2008, he took up a foreign ministry posting in the USA. Three years later, Paul returned home to Israel where he served as a spokesperson in the Foreign Ministry for four years. In 2015, he was appointed Israel's Ambassador to Senegal and five other countries in West Africa. He ran the Israeli embassy in Dakar until returning to Israel in late 2018. In 2019, Ambassador Hirschson took on responsibility for relations with the Caribbean Community. In 2021, he was appointed Consul General to Quebec and Atlantic Canada.



#### A SHABBAT ROSH HASHANA MESSAGE FROM REVEREND AMIEL BENDER

#### Let Us Have a "Feel-Good" Year

In next week's Torah portion of Parashat Haazinu, we will read about a trying moment for Moshe Rabeinu. On the last day of his life Hashem instructs him to ascend to the summit of mount Nevo, from where he will see the Promised Land before his passing on the mountain. Hashem's words ring loud and clear: For from afar, you will see the land, but you will not come there, to the land I am giving the children of Israel (Devarim 32:52).

It is a difficult narrative to read. Moshe goes up the mountain and he sees Israel. Our revered leader gets to see the country, but not to go there. If there is a comforting measure, it is that Moshe merited to see that his beloved Bnei Yisrael were going to הארץ - the good land that Hashem promised them. We know how much Moshe loved his nation and we can imagine that knowing that following his passing his people would flourish in the promised land flowing with milk and honey gave him peace of mind. The Ramban says the following in his commentary to Devarim 34:1 –

וטעם המראה הזאת אשר הראהו בעבור שהיתה הארץ מלאה כל טוב, צבי לכל הארצות, ומאשר היה גלוי לפניו רוב האהבה שהיה משה רבינו אוהב את ישראל, שמחו ברבות הטובה בראות עיניו

The reason for [G-d] showing [Moshe Rabbeinu the land] because the land was filled with all that was good and pleasurable than all other lands, and being that it was known before Him [i.e. G-d] that Moshe Rabbeinu loved [the people of] Israel, he would be happy with seeing the great good [which G-d would be giving to the people of Israel] with his own eyes

As he was about to depart the world, Hashem gave Moshe, in modern terminology, a feel-good moment, a moment of empathy, love, of sharing something that Moshe the recipient could appreciate, albeit under challenging circumstances, as he was about to depart the world.

Feel-good moments are inspiring, and the tone of these moments is powerful. They give us energy and they give us incentive. These moments can contribute to game changing in people's days and - I dare say - at significant intervals, their lives. I had to merit to start my week off with a feel-good moment. I was at the Sunday morning minyan, and I opened a sefer that I keep at my place in shul called the *Divrei Yitzchak* from Rabbi Isaac of Munkatsch. In the book I opened to item #38 - n" and read the following:

שמעתי בשם הרב הקדוש מ' מאיר מפרמישלאן זללה"ה שאמר שמי שרוצה שיהיה לו יראת שמים באמת ילך על ציון של קבר ר' אלימלך ממליז'ענסק ויתפלל שם ויעשו דבריו פירות

I heard in the name of the holy Rabbi Meir of Premishlan z"I who said that anyone who wants to enhance his fear of heaven should go to pray at the tomb marking the resting place of Rabbi Elimelech of Lizensk and his words will bear fruit...

As I finished reading this idea, I realized that there were two brothers at the minyan whose late father came from Lizensk. I knew that they would appreciate this thought and following davening I shared it with them. What I overlooked was, that not only was there a family connection to Lizensk, but the brothers also pointed to a connection to Premishlan, as well, where their mother was born. This thought related to יראת שמים - fear of heaven connected the family to their roots on both sides of the family. Later that day one of the brothers enthusiastically approached me with gratitude for sharing Rabbi Meir's thought with him. Certainly, a feel-good moment.

There is a lot in our world to feel good about. My occupation at TBDJ and my musical directorships in the Jewish day schools of the city produce many feel-good moments which are a source of personal satisfaction and content to myself, but more importantly — to others. On the school side, there are precious moments and anecdotal jewels from the students which I make a point to share with their parents, in person, by text or with a phone call. I find, that in my classes, children tend to shine in special ways which reflect on their upbringing at home. My feel-good moment is being able to give the parents a feel-good moment by informing them about their children's positive participation.

While there is a lot to feel good about ourselves as individuals in our Jewish world with our dedication and devotion to the commandments between us and Hashem - מצוות בין אדם למקום, I like to think that the real feel-good moments come with a special flavour of Yiddishkeit where and when we feel good and care about others - מצוות בין - when we observe the commandments which prescribe positive behavior with our peers and when we have a chance to assist those around us. This is something that we can learn from the Ramban's commentary on Moshe Rabeinu. Even as Moshe was about to leave the world - and I'm sure there were many things on his mind at that moment - he was unselfishly happy for and thought about his people. I am not sure that there is anything that can equal that immense gesture.

As we enter this High Holiday season, we will pray from our machzorim, in which there are many prayers. The High Holidays aren't limited to praying for our own personal needs. A sizeable amount of our prayers is in plural as well. The High Holidays are also about praying for those around us, for other individuals who need prayers, and for our community, Israel and more. Praying for others, caring for others, and performing mitzvot that will benefit others produce feel-good moments.

Let us all pledge, as individuals and as the TBDJ and Montreal community, to multiply our feel-good moments over the next year of 5784 with the goal of reaching a feel-good year for all of us, for Klal Yisrael.

(For now, the status of each Eruv remains the same.) The boundaries of this Eruv, which we hope to publicize soon, will be constructed according to the Halachic standards that satisfy all the communities, so that every Jew will be comfortable carrying in any part of it, without exception. Please watch for details soon about this historic advance in the Achdut of our community.
