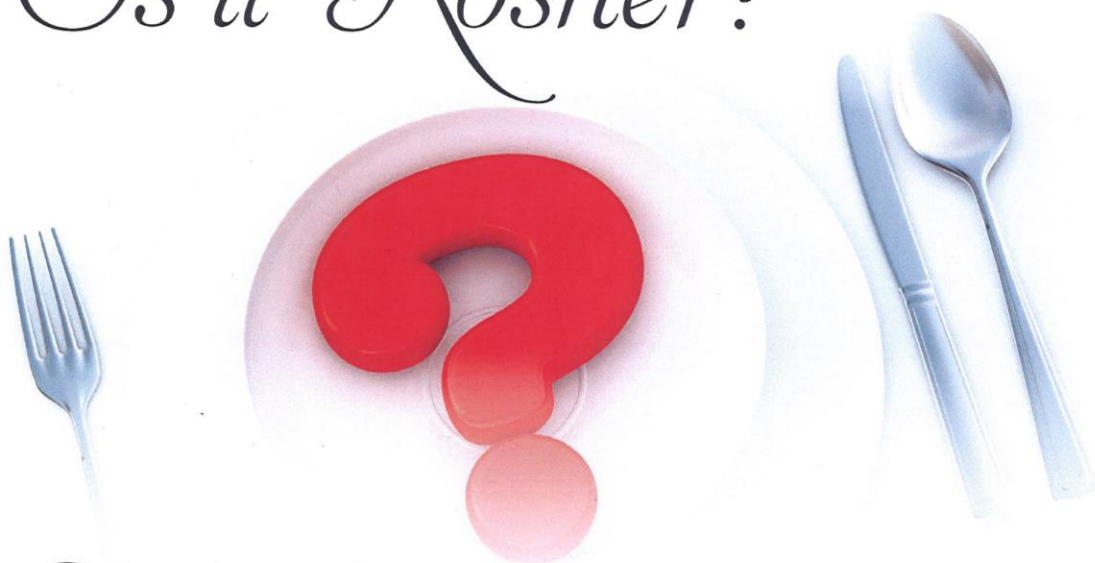

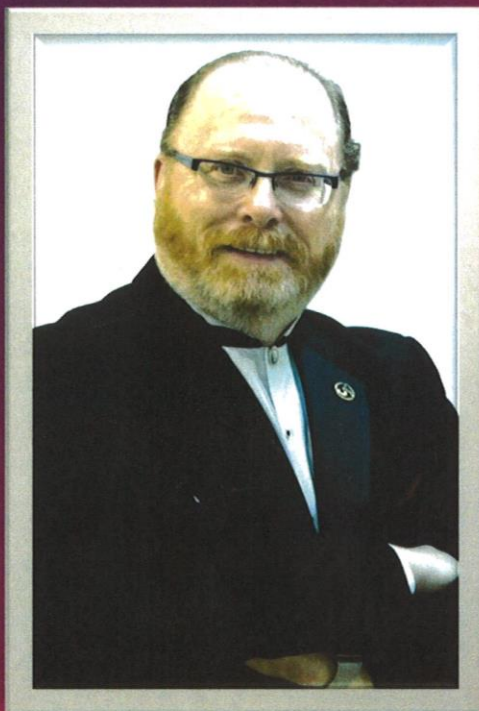

Cette exposition multimédia explore plus de deux-mille ans de présence juive en territoire ukrainien juxtaposés au cheminement historique des Ukrainiens. C'est à travers des images, des récits, des cartes et de courts films que l'exposition souligne l'interaction de ces deux peuples.

De concert avec cette exposition principale est présentée

une exposition dans le hall de la Bibliothèque publique juive de Montréal située au 5151 chemin de la Côte Sainte-Catherine, à Montréal, également du 1er au 11 septembre 2015 :

Impression de livres hébraïques et yiddish en territoire ukrainien

Présentation de livres hébraïques et yiddish imprimés en territoire ukrainien tirés de la collection de livres anciens de la Bibliothèque publique juive de Montréal.

Le territoire que comprend aujourd'hui l'Ukraine est depuis plusieurs siècles le foyer de diverses cultures florissantes, dont parmi elles l'une des plus anciennes et plus nombreuses communautés juives d'Europe. Cette communauté, composée principalement de Juifs de culture ashkénaze, vivait côte à côte avec la population chrétienne ukrainienne, à travers de longues périodes de coexistence marquées par une évolution complexe et métissée. De nos jours, on retrace en Ukraine les origines d'une grande majorité de Juifs de tradition ashkénaze.

Notre exposition explore la rencontre et l'histoire partagée des Juifs et des Ukrainiens — d'abord connus comme les Rus' ou les Ruthènes — de l'antiquité jusqu'au début de la Première Guerre mondiale. Cette exposition est présentée avec la croyance que ces deux peuples ont beaucoup à gagner dans l'apprentissage de leur expérience historique commune dans toute sa complexité. Malgré les périodes de crise et de violence intermittentes, Ukrainiens et Juifs vécurent côte à côte au fil des siècles, créant et partageant des cultures durables qui sont au cœur d'identités encore bien vivantes de nos jours.

Différents segments de l'exposition se concentrent sur la genèse et l'essor impressionnant du mouvement hassidique au sein de l'Ukraine, sur les transformations difficiles qui s'opérèrent chez ces deux peuples, longtemps privés d'un foyer national, lors du « long dix-neuvième siècle » au sein de l'Empire russe et sous la gouverne austro-hongroise, ainsi que sur la migration de grande échelle des Juifs et des Ukrainiens vers l'Amérique du Nord, en particulier au Canada, à partir des décennies de 1880 et de 1890.

L'exposition couvre la période allant jusqu'à 1914 et n'inclut pas le tumultueux vingtième siècle qui fut témoin de la Première Guerre mondiale, des violences qui succédèrent à l'effondrement de l'Empire russe, de la Grande famine en Ukraine (Holodomor), de la Grande Terreur sous Staline, et des horreurs de la Deuxième Guerre mondiale et de l'Holocauste. Plus encore, l'exposition ne couvre pas les mouvements de dissidents juifs et ukrainiens ou la construction d'un état démocratique ukrainien après la chute de l'Union soviétique. La Rencontre ukrainienne juive aborde la période subséquente à 1914 dans d'autres programmes, et des publications traitant de ces sujets sont attendues en 2016.

Cette exposition ambulante fut créée en partie grâce au concours de Citoyenneté et Immigration Canada par la Rencontre juive ukrainienne (RJU) / Ukrainian Jewish Encounter (UJE), un organisme de bienfaisance multinational. Parmi les partenaires montréalais, nous comptons la Bibliothèque publique juive, la Fédération nationale ukrainienne du Canada et le Dialogue Ukrainien-Juif de Montréal (DUJM).

Facts You Should Know

- In the U.S. there are more than 90,000 people waiting for kidney transplantation.
- Each year, 35,000 people are added to the waiting list.
- The average wait time for a transplant is between 3 to 4 years.
- Approximately 6,000 kidney living donor transplants are performed annually in the U.S.
- Each year, 4000 people die waiting for a kidney.
- In my home state of Florida 1,000 people are on the waiting list for a kidney transplant at the Miami

Transplant Institute – a transplantation center with an unrivaled success rate.

- The kidney donor procedure is minimally invasive, with a 1-2 day hospital stay.
- Kidney donors find the experience extremely rewarding and resume their regular activities very quickly and in excellent health.

Living Donation

In my case, I cannot wait 3 to 4 years for a kidney to become available. If I can obtain a living donor, the wait time will be eliminated and my life can be saved.

Who Can Be a Living Donor?

A living donor can be anyone between the ages of 18 and 65. The person must be in good physical and mental health. Donors with blood type O are the best candidates to be a match for me but other blood type individuals can participate in a donor exchange program as well, increasing the chances of the recipient to obtain a kidney. Potential donors will be tested to see if they are a compatible match. All details for the donor will be provided on request.
