

Where are the Jews who were exiled from Jerusalem to Babylon after the destruction of the first Temple?

In 1930, the population of Baghdad was a THIRD Jewish. Jews were living in Babylonia (Iraq) without interruption from 586BC to 1950, when most were forced to leave. Come hear a story of a Baghdadi-born Jew, whose comfort rooted in ancient traditions and complex integration and separation from her Muslim neighbours was shattered.

This comfort of over 2500 years was shattered by the international politics surrounding the rise of secular Arab Nationalism as a response to Turkish Ottoman domination, Jewish Political Zionism as a response to dire European discrimination, and finally, the establishment of the modern state of Israel.

Lisette will talk about the 2500 years of Jewish existence in Iraq, where the Babylonian Talmud was written, and where many Jewish prophets are buried.

She will talk about the many contributions Iraqi Jews made to the financial, educational and medical fields, including the building of $\,$ modern Iraqi infrastructure in the 1920s.

Since the Second World War, Ukrainian and Jewish activists have increasingly worked together to advance universal human rights, to promote social justice and cooperation, and to further democratic principles and rule of law in the region. This lecture will explore the evolving relationship between the two communities by examining the ways in which Ukrainian and Jewish advocacy, action, and commemoration have converged in Ukraine today.

The Honourable Irwin Cotler, P.C., O.C., is Founding Chair of the Raoul Wallenberg Centre for Human Rights, a McGill University Emeritus Professor of Law, and former Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada. An outstanding international human rights lawyer and constitutional and comparative law scholar, Professor Cotler is a member of the Order of Canada, the holder of eleven honorary doctorates, and the recipient of many other prestigious honours and awards.

Dr. Victor C. Goldbloom, C.C., O.Q., a pediatrician, was the first Jewish Cabinet Minister in Quebec, the province's first Minister of the Environment, Official Languages Commissioner of Canada, and President of the Canadian and International Councils of Christians and Jews. A member of the Orders of Canada and Quebec, Dr. Goldbloom received numerous honours and awards during his lifetime, including a knighthood conferred by the Vatican into the Order of St. Sylvester.

Following the Memorial Lecture, the recipient of the *Building Bridges* award will be announced. The award, named after Dr. Goldbloom's 2014 memoir, has been created in honour of his unique contributions to interfaith and interethnic dialogue.
