אין דבר נעלם ממך ואין נסתר מנגד עיניך.....

for Sukkot will be

Nothing disappears from you. And there is nothing hidden from thine eyes...

These words are recognizable from our Yom Kippur liturgy. During this period of our Jewish year we are conscious of the fact that our deeds of the past year are influencing our divine personal judgement. It is quite a sobering thought which brings on a necessity for some deep personal introspection even as it is an opportunity for us to better ourselves.

Imagine that everything that we do all year is entered in a heavenly computer. Among the millions of Jewish files up there are stored our individualized, personal, divine computer folders, containing all of the data on us, positive and negative things that we know about as well as good and less good things that we may have inadvertently done during the year that we are unaware of. As nothing disappears from Hashem's eyes, these files are even more conclusive than the data Revenu Canada has on us! Actually, don't imagine....realize, understand and accept it! This is about our annual spiritual check up with חולים, the spiritual and ultimate healer of our people's iniquities, Hashem. שפרו מעשיכם - better your ways! This is the divine admonition of this season of repentance - Hashem is giving us a chance to cure our souls through intense teshuva.

In actuality, we should be in check all year with regard to the way we conduct ourselves. The problem is, many of us tune in to this frame of mind especially at this time of the year and with many of us, the thought of being scrupulous about our spiritual soul is pushed to our subconscious during the rest of the year. It isn't that we aren't behaving properly or in a Torah way during the year, rather the idea of our season of spiritual reckoning is pushed off until the High Holiday period, when in essence, we should be conscious of the way we conduct ourselves all year around.

Rabeinu Yonah explains the words in Pirkei Avot, Ethics of the Fathers: 2:1 -

ווכל מעשיך בספר נכתבין....

All of your deeds are written in the book...

...the Holy One, blessed be He, sees and knows all the actions of people and remembers everything as if it is written in front of Him, and He will repay evil for [a person's] evil deeds. This isn't about hiding and doing other things while not turning on your personal video camera at zoom event, or about passing a note in class while the teacher's back is to the students. This is about the realization that Hashem sees everything that we do... all the time. This is about the heavenly gates that are open with our lives hanging in High Holiday judgement balance during this holy and awesome season of repentance.

Scary? You better believe it! Is there anything we can do to influence the judgement and turn the balance in our favor? Absolutely!

You see, we all have the opportunity to right click the "Windows 5781" repentance opportunities in our divine computer folders. These clicks of our spiritual mouse deal with three kinds of sins/iniquities: Between us and Hashem: בין אדם למקום, between us and our friends: בין אדם לעצמו and between us and ourselves: + things in our own character and behavior that we unhappy with. While we are all familiar with Facebook, where we are ridiculously exposed and even judged by our peers, many whom we do not even know(!), within a much too expansive social environment, this is our personal edition of "Soulbook", edition 5781 where we are judged by the Almighty to the very roots of our physical and spiritual dimensions. On Soulbook we work on cleansing ourselves of our spiritual and social iniquities. We evaluate how we dealt with our friends in real time, not (only) virtual Facebook, did we share or post something that was not meant to be shared? We evaluate our own personal spiritual shares and posts. Of the 100 Brachot required daily, how did we "post" on a daily basis? Did we share with Hashem an honest and true appreciation and gratitude for everything in our lives? While Facebook is virtual – Soulbook is very very real...

Our spiritual mice vary in their clicks... For some of us the right click is a refresh button, for others it is a reset button and yet others may need to click a total reboot. Whatever the click, this is the time of season to make sure that our personal folders in the divine computer system are cleansed from any or all of the viruses/sins that threaten to take over and destroy our files.

My computer analogy continues with the divinely sounded megs of the RAM which remind us of the importance of our commitment to take the high holiday season cleansing process seriously. With every shofar blast the heavens are pierced with the wailing sound of the shofar accompanied our individual pleas and prayers. The Shofar which we have been sounding throughout the month of Ellul and this past week on Rosh Hashanah is our wakeup call in every meaning of the word!

Concluding my computer analogy is the amazing realization about the season of repentance: Hashem is micro-soft with us in listening to our pleas and prayers. I can recall as I'm sure many of you out there can, (but to avoid getting into trouble let me just speak for myself), that when I did something wrong as a young child I was full of fear when it came to approaching my father and saying: "Sorry Dad, won't do it again", with the fear of "tough love" judgement and punishment looming. When beseeching the Almighty we know that our prayers are lovingly accepted by our father in heaven. We approach Hashem with the confidence and realization that our prayers are always welcome. It makes resetting, refreshing and rebooting our individualized personal divine computer folders a comforting and optimistic process.

For all you apple users who might not have followed the Microsoft analogies, now is the time to "dip your apple" in the sweet honey of repentance! May we all be written in the Mac-book of life...
