The Seder begins with an invitation to those in need to join us in our homes for the Seder. One would not be blamed for questioning the sincerity of the head of the household as they sit around the Seder table extending this invitation to... everyone who is already at the table. Why do we start this way?

Rabbi Avraham Isaac Kook '5"T, the first chief Rabbi of Israel, taught that we begin the Seder this way because the moment we were freed from slavery our true essence could emerge. As soon as we re-enact the story of our liberation we engage in the acts most characteristic of us as a nation: Feeding the hungry. Thinking of others. Sharing our resources with those in need. It might not be practical Seder night, but the message

is transmitted as a value we hold dear. Freedom equals the ability to give of ourselves to others. On the night dedicated to instilling in ourselves and our children our core beliefs, we begin the Seder with a call to benevolence.

One of the characteristics of TBDJ that stands out in my mind is this *middah* of Kindness. Without question what makes me the most proud of my first months here at the Baily is to have seen and experienced



firsthand the selflessness and generosity that exists in our shul. With Rav Kook's idea in mind, as Rifki and I extend our warmest Pesach greetings to you, I'd like to add a special welcome to all of the guests and visitors who are joining us for Yom Tov. We are excited to share our first Montreal Pesach with you (in spring weather!) and hope to have a chance to greet each of you during the chag.


