Unfortunately, a new era of anti-Semitic acceptability is rearing its ugly head, and where and when it stops, no one knows. May G-d protect us all and bring comfort to those who have gone through this horrific tragedy.

ויותר יעקב לבדו ויאבק איש עמו...

Yaakov was left alone and a man fought with him.... Bereishis 32:25

Our sages tell us that this fight was actually a battle of good against evil. It was Yaakov, the father of the 12 tribes, against the angel of Eisav, which in reality represents the יצר הרע, the evil inclination that is sent to push our buttons, causing us to sin, to fall, and to stumble spiritually. However, hidden in the words of this verse is a keen insight into how the Yetzer Horah works. The verse says Yaakov was left alone. When a person feels that he or she is alone, when they feel no one cares, no one to connect with, that creates a state of vulnerability, a sense of sadness and depression which is the most fertile ground for the angel of Eisav to do his dirty work. When a person feels alone, when they don't feel loved, they are most susceptible to transgression, to negative behavior and just plain sadness. And when a person is not happy in life, that is the root cause of most of his issues. Sadness and the feeling of abandonment is the gateway to all sin. This concept is especially true in family life when dealing with our children. Of course, all parents love their children but sometimes that love does not register on their radar, and perception is reality.
