So Yaakov drew close to Yitzchak his father who felt him and said, "The voice is Yaakov's voice but the hands are Esav's hands." Bereishis 27:22

This seminal event of the brachos being given to Yaakov who impersonated his brother Esav has had ramifications till this very day. Yaakov was very reluctant to fool his father, but as the Ramban explains, Rivkah told him that if Esav received the blessings, they would belong to him and his progeny forever and Yaakov will never be able to defeat him. Yaakov agreed and therefore disguised himself as Esav and even imitated his voice. However, the question presents itself: why did Yaakov mention G-d's name which is something Esav would never do? Why didn't Yaakov imitate Esav's gruff manner of speaking? Since he didn't speak like Esav, this aroused Yitzchak's suspicion and made him wonder out loud "why the voice is the voice of Yaakov." The commentaries explain that while Yaakov was able to go along with all the other steps of deception, this was something he couldn't do. Speech is the window of one's soul. To speak in the coarse rude manner of Esav was impossible for him to do, for that would destroy his essence and he would have rather give up the brachos than to speak like an Esav. The trait of proper respectful speech

Esav, on the other hand, although he did excel in the mitzvah of honoring his father, he could not stop speaking to him in a crude and disrespectful fashion because that was, unfortunately, Esav's essence. How one talks says a great deal about who they are. Speaking with derech erez to everyone Jew or non-Jew, in the home or out of the home, is a crucial aspect in being a religious Jew. It's not just about manners. It's a core Jewish value to speak nicely. It's what made Yaakov who he was, and this trait has been passed down to us, that a defining sign of being a grandchild of Yaakov is the manner in which we express ourselves. Remember, words can build and words can destroy. The choice is ours.
