He explained that there were some counterfeit one hundred dollar bills in circulation that were almost impossible to distinguish from the real thing with a visual inspection. We may sometimes believe that what we are doing is right because we have rationalized our behavior, having convinced ourselves that we are indeed correct. There is a difference between "genuine" good and "counterfeit" good and we would do well to run our behavior through an apparatus to distinguish between the two. Such an apparatus would be another person who being free of personal bias, is capable of rendering an objective evaluation.
