The Talmud tells us that the Shechina (divine presence) is located above the head of a person who is ill. Because G-d's closeness to a person is proportionate to the extent that the person feels dependent on his own abilities or not, the more a person feels that he can manage on his own, the farther he is from G-d. Someone who is sick recognizes his lack of strength and is much less confident in his own power. He subjugates himself before his creator, thereby meriting a special closeness to G-d.
