BEGINNER'S GEMARA FOR WOMEN	An introductory class for women to build the foundational skills and knowledge necessary to learn Gemara independently. <i>Taught by Mrs. Gabrielle Berger</i>
MINCHAT CHINUCH	A study of the Chinuch and selected sections of the Minchat Chinuch commentary. <i>Taught by Mr. Herzl Ginsburg</i>
CONTEMPORARY CHALLENGES AND PRACTICAL HALACHIC APPROACHES	Consecutive short series dealing with diverse Halachic areas with a focus on practical Halacha.
