## Message From the Rabbi



Dear Schomre Israel Family,

Many years ago I saw a fascinating episode of the Twilight Zone. As I remember it, a farm couple had an alien visitor whom they hosted and extended all courtesies. The guest wanted to reciprocate and use his unearthly powers to grant the housewife her expressed desire. The housewife in doing her many tasks had often said, "if only I had another set of hands...". Lo and behold the visitor granted her wish and she now had her "desire" fulfilled.

A wise man said that there are three things for which we pray, but when they finally arrive we have difficulty dealing with and accepting them. We pray for rain, old age, and the truth. When the rain comes people say why did it have to come today why not another day, why not at night, why not at a more convenient time and place? When blessed with old age, we may start to experience the weakening of our bodies and inability to do all the things we used to be able to do, along the other infirmities of the "golden years". Likewise, we say we want the truth, but what happens when we are actually confronted with it. I'm not referring to a wife who asks her husband how do I look in this dress - does it make me look fat?

What he meant was what about the serious discussions about truth. What happens after 120 years when we leave this world. What has been the purpose of my existence, what did I receive from my ancestors and what am I leaving behind. I never wished for an extra set of arms, what I did wish for was a house without a mortgage, no need to go into work every morning, enough money to do the things that I wanted to do.

Jewish tradition teaches us that there are a number of questions that we were asked when we come before the heavenly throne after 120 years. Were you honest in business, did you set aside time for Torah study, were you involved in family, did you hope for the Mashiach?

For many of us, this might be the time when we can actually use our financial security and available time as we choose, and direct our energies to be able to answer those questions of truth in truth with a resounding YES we fulfilled our goal. Make a daily time to study some aspect of Torah, increase your attendance and participation in valuable, meaningful activities and give your family the heritage of Jewish living through acts of charity extended beyond your immediate family.

### **Tu B'Shevat (15<sup>th</sup> of Shevat)**

Tu B'Shevat (the New Year for the trees) falls on Monday, January 21, 2019. At this time of the year in Israel, winter has just passed and the sap is beginning to fill the trees with the promise of spring. It is the time of year which was appropriately fixed for computing the annual tithes of fruit, but its significance today is entirely as a nature festival which expresses the close ties binding Israel to the Holy Land. It is called "Chamisha Asar B'Shevat" and "Rosh Hashanah Lailanot" (New Year for the Trees). It is customary to eat various fruits on the festival, and to plant trees and other plants.

## PURIM INFORMATION

1. **Purpose:** Purim is celebrated in commemoration of the deliverance of the Jews in Persia from the hands of Haman, the King's officer, who plotted their death. The events narrated in the Book of Esther took place in the middle of the fifth century B.C.E.

2. **Date:** The 14<sup>th</sup> of Adar. The 15<sup>th</sup> of Adar is known as Shushan Purim since in the capital, Shushan, the Jews had to defend themselves against their enemies on the 14<sup>th</sup> and celebrated the Festival a day later.

3. **Name:** It is called Purim from the word '*Pur*' which means "lot" and refers to the evil machinations of Haman who cast lots to determine on which day he should arrange for the slaughter of the Jews of Persia.

### 4. **Observance:**

(a) **In the Synagogue:** On the eve of Purim and on Purim morning the Book of Esther is chanted to a special melody. At the mention of Haman the children stamp their feet or turn their "graggers" (noisemakers) in derision of the name of the arch enemy. Three-cornered Purim pastries (Hamentashen) are served.

(b) **In the Home:** Being a joyful Festival, Purim is the occasion for parties and celebrations. A festive meal, Seudah, is the occasion for a happy family gathering. Charity is distributed and there is an interchange of gifts, particularly food gifts, between friends and neighbors. It might be noted that the character of Purim is really unique and quite unlike other festivals in the spirit of its observance. There is a deliberate absence of the solemn and highly spiritual character which dominates in other festivals. Purim is observed rather in a mood of sanctioned frivolity. From days of old, masques and parades and even bonfires have been elements in the day's festival program. Purim was kept as a carnival day. In modern times something of its spirit is found in the Purim parades and carnivals in Israel.

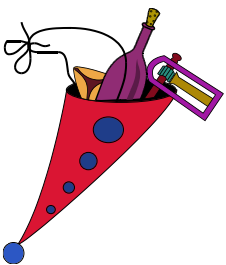

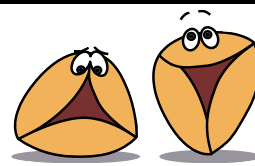
