

ASK THE RABBI

- Q. I was looking through my Jewish library and noticed something really incredible: The longest chapter in Psalms (chapter 119) has 176 verses. The longest Parsha in the Torah, Naso, has 176 verses. And the longest tractate in the Talmud, Baba Batra, has 176 pages. What is the connection between all these?
- A. Chapter 119 of Psalms has 176 verses because it follows a pattern whereby the 22 letters of the Hebrew alphabet are used to begin 8 verses each. That is, 22-times-8 equals 176.

Which of course raises the question: What is the significance of 22 and of 8?

22 is a number of completeness, because it is the full representation of the 22 letters of the Alef-Bet - i.e. everything from A to Z (from Alef to Tav).

As for the number 8: We know that 7 represents the "natural realm" - i.e. 7 days of the week, 7 notes in the musical scale, etc. But 8 represents completeness beyond nature - a completeness in the spiritual realm. That is why Brit Milah is held on the 8th day of a boy's life. This also explains why G-d first commanded Abraham to perform circumcision with the words, "Walk before Me and be complete" (Genesis 17:1).

The product of two "complete" numbers, "22-times-8," is therefore the ultimate completeness. That's why 176 is used to demonstrate the supernal perfection of our holy Torah.


ELUL SHOFAR BLOWING

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF TISHA B'AV


The saddest day of the year, Tisha B'Av, commemorates several tragedies. These include:

- A. The destruction of both the first and second Temples in Jerusalem (586 B. C.E. and 70 C.E.).
- B. The fall of Bethar in the Bar-Kochba rebellion (135 C.E.). This disaster marked the end of all Jewish aspirations for freedom from Rome.
- C. In later centuries other sad occurrences were associated with this day. Among them the expulsion of the Jews from Spain in 1492.

The severity of Tisha B'Av equals that of Yom Kippur in that both fast days commence on the previous evening. The atmosphere in Shul is gloomy, the lights are dimmed, the curtain is removed from the Ark and most worshipers sit on low stools or on the floor. The Book of Lamentations (Megillas Eichah) is read, and the special Kinos (prayers of lamentations) are recited.

Among other Halachic injunctions observed on Tisha B'Av are:

- 1. Complete fasting.
- 2. No bathing.
- 3. No conjugal relations.
- 4. No leather shoes are worn (rubber or canvas shoes are allowed).
- 5. It is even prohibited to study Torah on this day because Torah study is considered a very great joy and happiness. (There are certain texts that are permitted).
- 6. It is not customary to greet people with the usual greetings such as "hello" or "good morning". However, if you are greeted by someone who doesn't know the law, you should answer in a soft voice in order not to offend or hurt their feelings.
- 7. One should try to avoid business transactions or important decisions on this day if possible. Needless to say, in all cases where health is an issue the law is very lenient. The Rabbi should be consulted in all such cases.

On April 16, 2007, the Board of Directors approved the following procedures regarding High Holiday services:

- 1 There will be no charge to a non-member the first time he/she attends High Holiday Services.
- 2 If the same person/family attends a second year, the charge will be \$100 per person. If the non-member decides to join Schomre Israel, the monies will be credited towards the membership fee.
- 3 Immediate relatives (adult children/parents/siblings) of Schomre members who live within the greater Poughkeepsie area will be charged (see #1 & #2).
- 4 Immediate relatives (adult children/parents/siblings) of Schomre members who live more than 25 miles from the greater Poughkeepsie area will not be charged.

We encourage members to invite non-affiliated relatives and friends who live in our area to become members of Schomre.

Membership includes High Holiday privileges.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

For those of you with a vegetable garden or after a visit to a local Farmers Market --

Tomato-Cucumber Salad

2 med tomatoes, sliced
1 med cucumber, peeled and thinly sliced
½ red onion, thinly sliced, separated into rings

Place in bowl.

½ cup salad oil

¼ cup vinegar

1 Tbsp salt

1 teas dried basil crushed

1 Tbsp dried tarragon, crushed

I 1/8 Tbsp pepper

Mix well and pour over tomatoes, etc. Chill several hours.
