Shacharit - 9:00 AM
Yizkor - 11:00 AM
Mincha/Maariv - 7:20 PM
Pesach ends - 8:31 PM
Wait till after 9:30 PM to eat chametz

FAST OF THE FIRST BORN

Passover Eve is a traditional Fast for the First Born in recognition of the Jewish firstborns being spared the plague in Egypt. By attending/participating in a Siyum, the completion of a Tractate of Talmud on Friday morning, April 19, the first born are exempt from fasting. Rabbi Langer will conduct the Siyum. The Service starts at 7:00 AM.
